Position Description

Role

The Chair of the ANS Equity and Diversity Committee takes the lead on all issues related to gender balance, underrepresented minorities, the LGBTQIA+ community, and disability in the society and at the annual meetings.

Duties and Responsibilities

- 1. Promote the interests of the above groups at ANS Council meetings.
- 2. Develop and support the ratification of policies and procedures to make ANS fairer, more diverse, and more inclusive.
- 3. Oversee the implementation of these policies and procedures once ratified.
- 4. Encourage diversity and gender balance in speaker invitations, symposium selection, and oral presentation selection at the annual conference.
- 5. Communicate E&D objectives and initiatives to the ANS community though the ANS Newsletter and other channels.
- 6. Coordinate and lead meetings of the E&D Committee, and relay outcomes of these meetings to the ANS Council.
- 7. Ensure a diverse and sustainable E&D Committee, including succession planning for leadership of the committee.

ANS Council attendance

- Attend ANS Council meetings, the ANS Annual Scientific Meeting and the Annual General meeting (or arrange a substitute if unable to attend), and convey members' concerns and contribute to general debate.
- 2. Provide timely reports to ANS Council on E&D-related activities.
- 3. Occasionally attend functions as a representative of the ANS, *e.g.* symposia on science and technology policy, 'Science Meets Parliament' event, Gender Equity and Diversity workshops, *etc.*
